Bed and Sofa was created in 1927 by Soviet film director Abram Room and “has become regarded as a great little masterpiece of the silent era” (John DeBartolo). The movie depicts an extremely tense, if trivial, love triangle in the pitifully small living quarters of early Soviet-era Moscow. Both bitter and funny, the film promotes an empathetic view of women’s liberation.
